- Terminology Alignment
- Why Standardize?
  - More wood, fewer arrows (efficiency, fix problem once and for all)
  - ☐ Interoperability (programmatic & operational)
- Pitfalls of Standarization
  - ☐ Migrations are Expensive! And may not prove locally optimal (80/20 solutions)
  - Weakened sense of ownership
  - Can stifle innovative problem solving
  - ☐ Weakens development skillsets as teams leverage common solutions
  - Requires completion of adoption to see benefits, at which point leverage over central solution is diminished
- How to manage them












#### Before Standardization



#### After Standardization (Platonic ideal)









